

A message from our Trust Chaplain...

If you have not heard of Captain Tom this week I will be very surprised. Captain Tom Moore, wanted to do something to help the NHS in this time of crisis. He decided to walk one hundred laps of his back garden (25metres in length) and he wanted to do this before his 100th birthday on April 30th! He was hoping to raise £1000.

On Thursday 16th of April, Captain Tom completed his final ten laps. He did not raise £1000, he raised £28 million! By this time, he had become a national hero and today was awarded the 'Pride of Britain' Award for bringing hope to the nation through his humble and cheerful show of determination and resilience.





Capt. Tom considers himself as an ordinary citizen just doing his bit to help out! For me, he is so much more. He has shown how the smallest of gestures can make the most enormous difference. In his wildest dreams, he did not imagine how his one hundred laps of his garden would impact on so many people, not just in the UK but around the world. Each one of us can be totally inspired by this gesture to help out and transform the lives of others. He has done so much more than that... he has shown how a simple act of kindness can spread like a ripple, touching the hearts of all of us... encouraging us to do the same!

Every day we can consciously make small gestures of kindness, whether to those close to us or to strangers who need our help.
