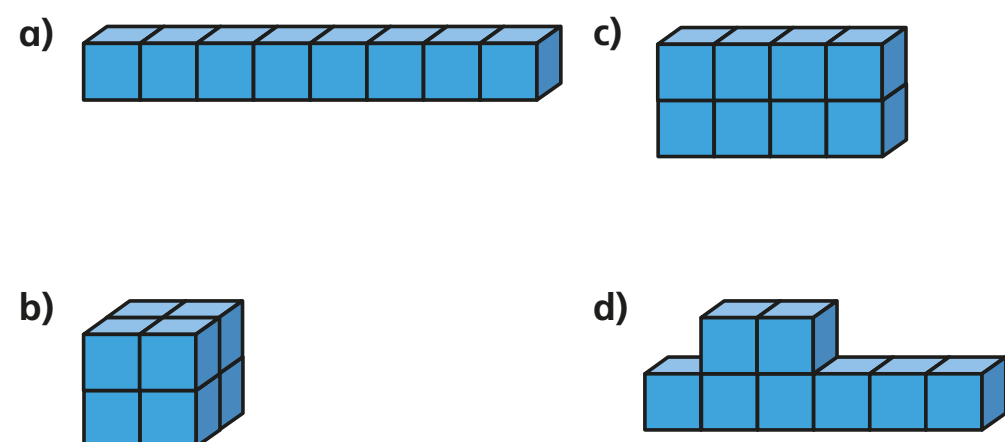


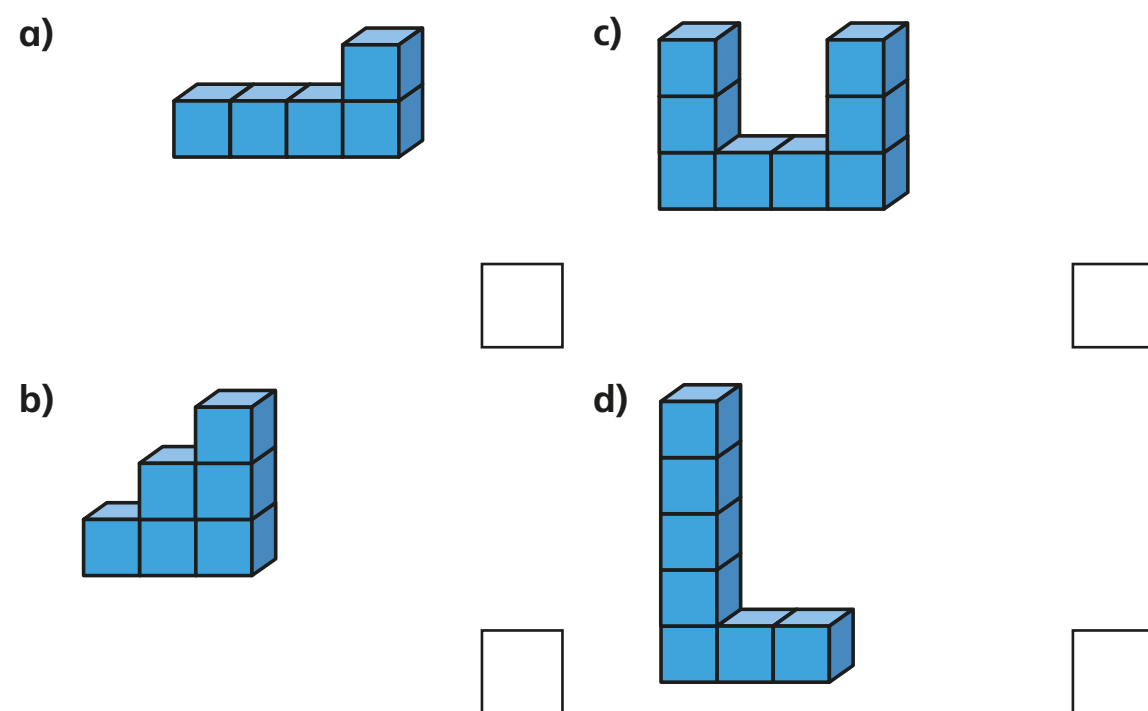
# Make 3D shapes

Make each of the 3D shapes.



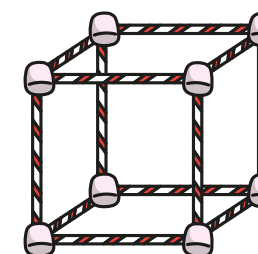
- 2 How many cubes do you need to make each 3D shape?

a) What did she use to make the edges of the cube?




b) How many edges does the cube have?

c) What did she use for the vertices of the cube?

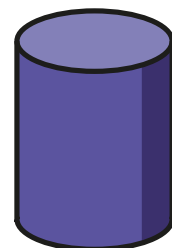
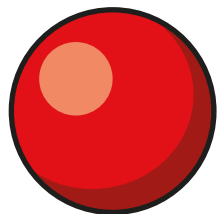
d) How many vertices does the cube have?

- 6 Try to make the shapes using cubes.

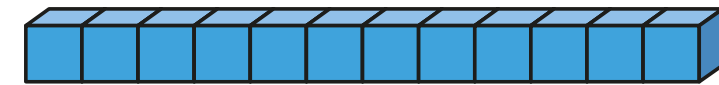

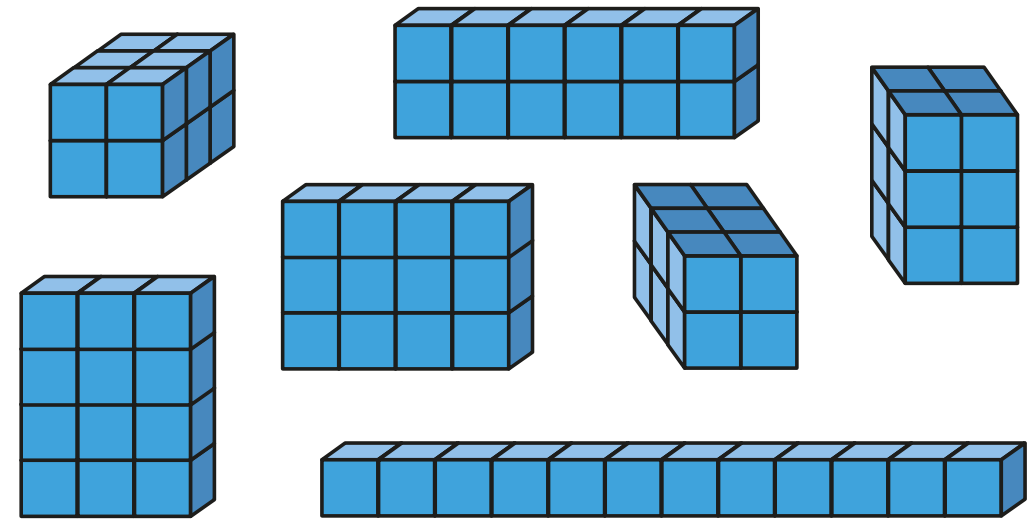

- 7 Filip has 12 cubes.



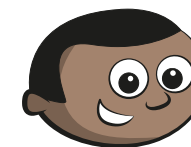
He puts them together to make cuboids.



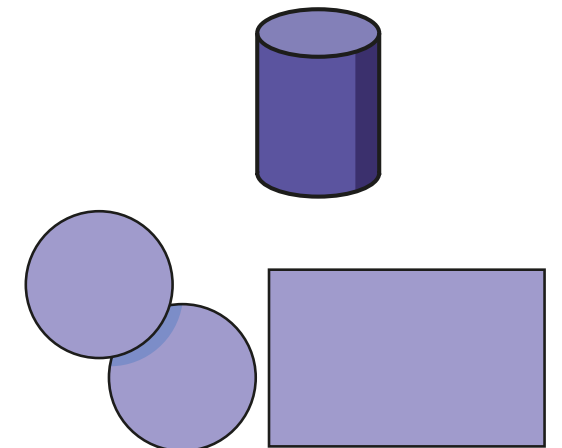
How many **different** cuboids has Filip made?
