

# Dear Parents & Carers...



This week is Catholic Education week. On Education Sunday, Mrs Dodds said a few words at The Cathedral.

"Following Jesus, The Good Shepherd, in all we say and do.

Our mission is to serve others and never more has it been as poignant as it is today – In times like these our community has come together.

Our staff, in particular our Family Support Worker has worked closely with The SVP and other local charities to help provide food for many of our families. Our teachers have worked tirelessly since March, providing online learning, phone calls home in addition to teaching their own children.

We worked hard in July to bring all our children back in attempt to alleviate their fears and anxieties and to prepare them for a new way of schooling in September.

We worked through summer to ensure our building was clean and safe and with the support of our Trust and governors we reopened to all children.

When asked about moving onto secondary school at the end of this year, one of our children said he wished he could just stay at The Good Shepherd until the end of his school time. That is testimony to the Love and Care each child and member of our school community emanates.

These past few months have been like no other but we know God that God is with us and we know that together we are strong.
