#### Dear Parents & Carers,

Thank you for your continued patience over the past few weeks. We cannot tell you how much we miss the children and cannot wait to have everyone back in school. For those of you worrying that your child may be behind in their learning, please be reassured that there will be a lot of children across the world in a similar position. I know that we, along with every other school, will do our best to put a programme in place to support children to catch up.

We would like to reassure you that the children in school are being taught the same lessons as the children who are not in school. Teachers create one plan and deliver it to all children in their class and this has been really tricky, particularly when the class teacher has to be in school and deliver to children at home and in school at the same time.

Thank you to all the parents who have fed back to us about home learning. We are slowly making our way through each year group and making necessary adjustments to support everyone.

We would ask that parents supervise children when they are engaged in online learning. If the teacher's internet drops out, please wait for 5 minutes and if the teacher has not joined the lesson, please leave the lesson. Your child can continue their learning using the lesson plans usually stored in 'Files' or on IXL and Purple Mash.

Please be aware that if your camera and microphone are on. You can be seen and heard by all children and families who are attending the lesson so please be mindful of others in the household. We would also ask that you ensure children are dressed appropriately and ready to learn. If you have not done so already, please click <a href="here">here</a> to sign the consent form allowing us to film lessons.

It is really important that children only join the lesson and leave the lesson when the teacher is present. They must not join outside this time. We would ask that you remind your child that the 'chat' forum is not a social media platform and must only be used for learning. We are working extremely hard to provide 'live' lessons but we cannot supervise in some cases fifty children in fifty different households in addition to the children being taught in school. If you are unable to supervise due to work commitments, please watch the lesson/or go through lesson notes at a later time when you are able to work alongside your child. We really do understand how challenging it is to work from home and support your child. Keep in touch and share your situation and we will try to help and support as best we can. I would remind you of my previous letter in which I said, if it all becomes too much, turn off the computer and get outside for some fresh air and come back to it later. Your own mental health and that of your child's is very important.

A big thank you to all of our children learning at home! You are all helping us learn new ways in working.


Another big thank you to the Mum's and Dad's, Nan's and Grandad's and other carers! You are all amazing and are doing a fantastic job!
