

Dear Parents and Carers.

Thank you all for your continued support this past year. We have received updated information around relaxing some of the COVID-19 restrictions next week after the government announced that the country's roadmap out of lockdown is on track and Step 3 will go ahead as planned on 17 May.

There have now been changes made and the government have released updated guidance for schools and further education settings with details of the changes, including face coverings, domestic school trips, wraparound provision and extracurricular activity and exam cohort attendance and provision.

As a school, we have decided to continue wearing face masks around school in-between lessons. We are asking parents and carers to continue wearing masks at drop off and collection times at least until half term when we can review the situation further.

We are continuing with regular hand washing and sanitizing. In fact we are pretty much keeping things as they are until half term at least.

We are looking to open our own after school club after half term. More details will follow.
