As we approach the end of our first term, I would like to write to celebrate all the wonderful work we have seen this term from the children.

Last year, as we returned from Covid we very much focused on Reading/Writing/Religious Education/ Mathematics and Personal and Social Development. More recently, we began to look closely at the wider curriculum such as Design and Technology, Music, French, History, Geography, Science, Art, Music and Computing.

Teachers spent the September training days getting their heads around CUSP (Our new curriculum).

We have worked extremely hard to introduce the new curriculum and it is clear in the children's books that they are developing a deeper knowledge of a range of subjects. There is a real focus on vocabulary which was evident in our recent pupil voice. We were blown away with how well Year 2 could articulate their learning around The Great Fire of London. Whilst Year 1 could explain their focus of maps in Geography and continents. In Year 3 they could explain what Palaeolithic means!

We would encourage you to ask your children at home about their learning. For example; what have you been learning about in History/Geography/Art? Ask them about the new vocabulary they have learnt.

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I have been in numerous lessons over the past few weeks and I can see first-hand, children fully engaged in their learning and able to articulate what they have been learning both in the classroom and beyond in PE/Forest School.



We look forward to sharing your children's books with you over the year ahead. We can now inform you that Parents Evening will be taking the same process as last year with one session being on TEAMS and the other face to face.
